- Tuesday, Feb. 7, Give Back Day. Rally around your school community by focusing on ways for your chapter to give back.

- **Thursday, Feb. 9, Advocacy Day.** Amplify CTE in your community by conducting a local public relations activity, such as presenting to school board members, administrators and community leaders.
