National Signing Day chapter opportunities

- Signing Day supply bundles valued at \$500 will be awarded to 10 chapters (schools must register five or more students and complete the <u>supply bundle application</u> by March 29 to be eligible).
- Signing Day <u>school grants</u> of \$250 will be awarded to 25 schools to enhance their event (schools must register five or more students and apply by March 29 to be eligible).

Early registrant opportunities

- Signing Day Starter Kit: Signing Day table runner, pack of 10 certificates, 10 pens, while supplies last (schools must register five or more students).
- Signing Day T-shirts: The first 2,000 student registrants receive a National Signing Day T-shirt.

>>> Apply for the Harbor Freight Tools for Schools Prize for Teacher Excellence

Applications are now open for the <u>Harbor Freight Tools for Schools Prize for Teaching Excellence</u> <u>awards</u>. The prize recognizes outstanding instruction in the skilled trades in U.S. public high schools and the teachers who inspire students to learn skills to prepare for life after graduation. In 2024, Harbor Freight will award \$1.5 million in cash prizes to 25 skilled trades teachers and their programs. In 2023, the prize recognized 16 SkillsUSA instructors as winners. Applications must be received by **May 3.** Finalists will be announced June 11 and winners will be announced this fall.

>>> Big Scholarship Opportunities for College/Postsecondary Students

The Horatio Alger Association is offering 500 career and technical education scholarships at up to \$2,500 each to students who've overcome obstacles and wish to pursue a career and technical education at an accredited, nonprofit college/postsecondary institution. >>> College Gable Grants from Lowe's

The Lowe's Foundation has launched Gable Grants: a commitment to preparing the next generation of skilled tradespeople. Through the Gable Grants program, the Lowe's Foundation will provide \$50 million over the next four years to community and technical colleges and community-based nonprofit organizations. Those funds will help prepare 50,000 job-ready skilled tradespeople to build a stronger infrastructure that supports communities for the long term. Lowe's is looking for community and technical colleges working to increase the number of young and diverse people in the workforce, especially from underrepresented and rural communities. Lowe's is currently accepting unrestricted grant applications from community and technical colleges through March 31.
